This is useful for organizations with several presentations or lectures that reoccur often – each channel may have its own settings that are saved as presets. It permits unique customization for each channel recording. For example, a weekly class or presentation may have unique graphic overlays preset for a particular department or organization.

- Dynamic Text Overlays:

This enables closed-caption work, changeable text (e.g. stock tickers, news headlines, course announcements) and last minute changes/entries (e.g. speaker name, conference title).

- Offers over 400 graphical overlays
- Channel Save & Restore:

The ability to save channel configurations for the entire unit or for an individual presentation onto a USB stick for backups and easy configuration of a large number of devices.
